The Special pulls together relevant highlights from recent months, making connections between education, business, government and the wider community. It aims to encourage everyone to look beyond the usual places for their inspiration – and dangerous ideas!

# Further & Higher Education

#### **RESEARCH, PLANNING & LEADERSHIP**

- UK research councils, **Scotttish Funding Council** (**SFC**) and other higher education funding bodies launched a new Research Excellence Framework impact case study database. The searchable resource includes almost 800 case studies submitted by researchers at Scotland's 19 universities. (29) A rich resource a search for 'innovation' reveals 1,479 case studies, including 154 from Scotland.
- **SFC** published:
- Outcome Agreements 2015–16 for colleges & universities, including creating an Innovation Challenge fund.
- A draft Strategic Plan 2015–18 focusing on outcomes including in innovation. (30)

There are eight SFC funded Innovation Centres.

- CDN launched a new <u>Developing Leaders Programme</u> particularly for recently appointed managers or those looking for development tools or frameworks. (29)

  An Emerging Leaders Programme was launched in 2012–13.
- Researchers from University of Glasgow <u>CREATe</u> <u>Centre</u> and <u>University of Bournemouth</u> launched <u>online learning materials</u> to help students and the public understand copyright law. (28)

#### **ENTERPRISE & EMPLOYABILITY**

- Comhairle nan Eilean Siar, Lews Castle College UHI, Skills Development Scotland (SDS), SQA, Sector Skills Councils and employers, launched progression pathways in engineering and health & social care sectors for S5/S6 pupils. Courses combine work-based skills with school/college study. (28)
- Quality Assurance Agency published Employability and Graduate Attributes, a report of eight Scottish institutions. Examples include innovative methods of employer engagement, careers services and work-based learning. 30
- Robert Gordon University (RGU) MSc Digital Marketing students created The Digital Scot to develop and showcase skills learnt during their studies. It provides opportunities to gain work experience and attract employers. 30

  In similar schemes, Edinburgh Napier University
  Publishing students produce Buzz magazine; Glasgow Clyde
  College Journalism students launched Clyde Insider; and
  University of Glasgow vet students run Trusty Paws Clinic.
- Interface extended the Innovation Voucher Scheme to include applications from James Hutton Institute, Moredun Research Institute, and colleges working to provide services to SMEs in the construction sector. (28)

#### **IMAGINATIVE PARTNERSHIPS**

- University of Edinburgh signed a Memorandum of Understanding with National Galleries of Scotland to collaborate on research projects, exhibitions and resources for the study of Scottish art. (28)
- STV is working with University of the West of Scotland (UWS) to deliver local TV in Ayr, with North East Scotland College and RGU in Aberdeen, and Dundee & Angus College and Abertay University in Dundee. Students will access professional learning & work opportunities. 29

  STV already works with Glasgow Caledonian University (GCU) and Edinburgh Napier University.
- Queen Margaret University (QMU) signed a <u>Strategic</u> <u>Alliance agreement</u> with **Alzheimer Scotland**. Aims include creating a 'dementia aware' university and a strategic approach to CPD for health professionals. (29)
- <u>University of Stirling</u> was awarded <u>European</u>

  Research Council funding to examine how humans differ from primates in learning skills and knowledge from others. The study will involve adults and young children plus **Edinburgh Zoo** chimpanzees and monkeys. (30)
- Edinburgh College is working with Melville Housing Association to offer free traditional construction skills training for apprentices, contractors, schools and home owners. The project supports the Dalkeith Corn Exchange regeneration. (30)
- Quantum technology research centre **QantIC** was launched, involving six UK Universities and over 30 industry partners. £3m is being provided by **SFC** to create a new 'innovation space' at the **University of Glasgow**. (28)

## Government & Wider Society

#### INNOVATIVE NATION, FUTURE LEARNING

- Scottish Government launched a <u>Scotland CAN DO</u> website, setting out the intention to become 'a world-leading entrepreneurial and innovative nation'. ②8

  'Innovation' is a priority in <u>Scotland's Economic Strategy</u>. ②9
- <u>Future City Glasgow</u> launched the <u>Data Launchpad</u>, a city data hub developed with <u>Microsoft UK</u>. Residents and businesses will be able to access information and contribute local knowledge via online tools and apps. (28)
- A <u>Salvesen Mindroom Centre</u> is to be established at **University of Edinburgh** to 'understand and resolve learning difficulties' in children and young people. The 'virtual' centre, a collaboration with **Mindroom** and the **NHS**, will be the first of its kind in the UK. (28)

## Business

#### A CHANGING WORKFORCE

- UK Commission for Employment & Skills (UKCES) published <u>labour market projections</u> for Scotland from 2012–22 as part of its Working Futures programme. (28) Careers of the Future was published in December 2014.
- UK Government's Business Champion for Older Workers published <u>A new vision for older workers</u> for those over 50. Recommendations include apprenticeships, addressing skills gaps and better training to manage older workers. (29) **Barclays** is to pilot an apprenticeship scheme for the over 50s later this year. (28)
- Health & Social Care Alliance Scotland launched My Skills, My Strengths, My Work, to support people with long term conditions access jobs and remain in work. (29)
- **Nesta** published:
- <u>Creativity vs Robots</u>, suggesting creative jobs will be much more resistant to automation than most other roles.
- The creative economy and the future of employment, calling for an end to 'bias against multi-disciplinary education' and for STEM to become STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts & Maths). (30)

Nesta's <u>Innovation Growth Lab</u> tests different approaches for entrepreneurship and growth.

- The first two regional <u>Invest in Young People Groups</u> were set up in <u>North-East Scotland</u> and <u>Glasgow</u> to improve links between education and employers and increase opportunities for young people. This is part of the Scottish Government's <u>Developing the Young Workforce Strategy</u>. 28
- The Scotland Office published <u>Womenomics: Scotland The role and contribution of women in the Scottish economy</u> by Prof Lesley Sawers. Recommendations include changing 'mainstream attitudes and behaviour', developing a UK-wide Gender Index and increasing 'inspiring role models'. (29)
- UKCES launched <u>Leadership and entrepreneurship</u>
  <u>in small firms</u>, the latest competition in its <u>UK Futures</u>
  <u>Programme</u> tackling 'workforce development problems'. 29

  Their latest competition launched in May is on gender and equality in the workplace.

#### **BUSINESS CREATION & GROWTH**

- New business plans for <u>Scottish Enterprise</u> and <u>Highlands & Islands Enterprise</u> (HIE) include 'an openness to innovation' and 'increasing support for innovation' respectively. (29) (30)

  HIE published a Creative Industries Strategy in 2014.
- Entrepreneurial Scotland launched a <u>Future Leaders</u> network with members identified as Entrepreneurs, Intrapreneurs, Creators, Do-ers, or Sellers. (30)

#### **CREATIVE SKILLS, CREATIVE APPROACHES**

■ **Creative Scotland**, in partnership with **SDS**, is to manage a new £1m <u>Screen Sector Skills Fund</u> in 2015–16 for those in the sector and young people considering a screen-related career.

SDS is due to publish a creative industries Skills Investment Plan (SIP). There are currently nine  $\underline{SIPs}$ . (28)

- W Dunbartonshire Council Working 4U service is offering <u>free driving lessons</u> for 17 to 24 year-old residents who are unable to pay, to help improve their chances of finding work. (29)
- University of Aberdeen and RGU are launching two new digital innovation hubs as part of the City Council's <u>Accelerate Aberdeen</u> programme. Business skills and support will also be offered via <u>Scottish Institute of Enterprise</u>. 30

  Similar hubs include <u>Elevator</u> Aberdeen; <u>Creative</u>

  <u>Exchange</u>, a joint City of Edinburgh–Edinburgh College initiative; and <u>The Hub</u> and <u>Creative Clyde</u> in Glasgow.

## Community & Adult Learning

#### **CREATIVE LEARNING SPACES & SKILLS**

- Nesta published an 'open dataset' of 97 <u>makerspaces</u> in the UK, up from nine in 2010. 35% of visitors are there to learn. 63% run school programmes, 26% affiliated programmes e.g. <u>CoderDojo</u> and <u>Raspberry Pi Jams</u>. 30 11 are listed in Scotland including <u>MAKLab</u>, <u>57North</u>, <u>Edinburgh Hacklab</u> and <u>T-Exchange</u>.
- Transition Extreme and RGU launched Extreme Art School, for groups of 16–21 year-olds not in education, training or employment. 30

Part of the <u>Alternative Academies</u> widening access programme that includes <u>Extreme Academy</u>.

- **Creative Scotland** awarded £100k to support 10 full-time 12-month places for 20–30 year-olds in its <u>Traineeships</u> <u>Programme</u> for the arts, screen and creative industries. (29)
- Scotland's Futures Forum is working with specialists to develop a <u>wellbeing MOOC</u>. (29)

  Massive Open Online Courses are available on a huge range of topics, e.g. via FutureLearn, Proversity & Coursera.

## Schools

Technologies Special.

#### **ADVANCING THE CURRICULUM**

- Education Scotland published <u>Learning for</u>
  <u>Sustainability</u>, the latest in the <u>Opening Up Great Learning</u>
  series of discussion papers. (28)
- **SQA** is developing new <u>qualifications in cyber security</u> at <u>SCQF</u> Levels 4, 5 and 6, believed to be the first of their kind for school pupils in Europe. (28)

A new **International Cyber Academy** was launched in May at Edinburgh Napier University.

- **SQA** announced from August 2015 teachers can develop their own National 4 Added Value Unit assessments. (28)
- Education Scotland published <u>Building Society: Young</u> <u>people's experiences and outcomes in the technologies</u>. It states technologies should promote creativity and problemsolving, real-time, real-world and digital technologies should be placed at the heart of learning. (29) <u>Education Scotland commissioned an Informed Scotland</u>

Scottish Government announced a new <u>Scottish</u>

<u>Attainment Challenge</u> to improve literacy, numeracy and health & wellbeing in primary schools. It will draw on the

experience of the London Challenge. (28)

- A new Skills Centre of Excellence was opened at Irvine Royal Academy with Ayrshire College, SFC, Edge Foundation and SDS funding. The aim is to prepare young people for work through more vocational options from S4–6 and better links with local business. (28)
- *TESS* reported findings of research into the Enterprising Schools Project pilot, run by **Young Enterprise Scotland**. Success depends on gaining whole-school support. (30)
- City of Edinburgh Council and Edinburgh
  International Festival launched a three year arts
  residency in Castlebrae Community High School. (29)
- Scottish Parent Teacher Council, supported by SDS, is to pilot a Partnership Schools model developed in the USA. It involves 'research-based and goal-oriented programmes of school, family and community partnerships'. (29)
- W Dunbartonshire Council has given every P7 pupil £10 to invest in a Credit Union account through The Starter for Ten initiative to develop money management skills. (28)
- Inverclyde Council secondary schools are piloting SafeSpotter developed by NHS and University of Glasgow to train older students as 'first points of contact' for those with mental health difficulties. (29)

#### **TEACHER DEVELOPMENT & ENQUIRY**

- A new master's qualification for headship developed by **Scottish College for Educational Leadership** (**SCEL**) will be introduced in August 2015 and become compulsory for all new headteachers from 2018–19. (28)
- General Teaching Council for Scotland (GTCS) is to develop 'MyProfessionalLearning', a National E-Portfolio for teachers. It will be piloted from August 2016. ②9 GTCS is piloting EducationHUB for teachers to share and review unpublished teacher research and enquiry.

  Pedagoo and SCEL are organising the first #EnquiryMeet.
- Scottish Educational Research Association is launching a <u>Leadership in Scottish Education Network</u>. 30
